JoREP 2.0 Joint Research Programmes database



WHAT IS JOREP 2.0 DATABASE

JoREP 2.D is a database on joint R&D programmes, which are (i) European-level publicly funded research initiatives, in principle open to all countries belonging to European Research Area (ERA) either because they are established by the European Union or because they are based on international treaties, and (ii) publicly funded research programmes established by a group of countries through a bilateral/multilateral agreement.

It provides a quantitative basis for the monitoring of investments in joint R&D programmes for 32 countries (EU28 countries plus 4 associated countries), pointing out the policy rationales behind them and their impact, and allows analyses of the modes of the ERA dynamics, figuring out the national strategies of participation.

AIM OF THE DATABASE

JoREP 2.0 allows understanding and interpreting the strategies adopted by the different actors involved in joint R&D programmes in terms of the underlying logics which frame their behaviour and decisions concerning if and how to establish joint R&D programmes, how to manage and implement it, linking the findings with broader conceptions of how European integration in the field of S&T policies should take place. JoREP 2.0 also supports, using network or spatial analyses methods, the analysis of important ERA dynamics and Europeanization processes through the study of the behaviour of main national actors (i.e. funding agencies).

TYPE OF ACCESS TO THE DATABASE

The type of access to JoREP 2.0 is 'on site' (the user/researcher comes on site and works on a project using the data).

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ACCESS TO JOREP 2.0 DATABASE

JoREP 2.0 is one of the facilities offered by EUFP7 RISIS project.

RISIS aims to serve the scientific community providing a large-scale infrastructure including IO datasets and 2 platforms.

Facilities host relevant data on research and innovation dynamics and policies covering six topics (for further info visit http://risis.eu).

In order to access JoREP 2.0 database, the researcher has to define a project based upon the use of the facility including

a description of the research purpose (see Procedure for the access).

Applicants are also encouraged to get in touch with the contact point in advance to agree on the work and calendar of the visit.

FINANCIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ACCESS

Researchers will have the opportunity to stay up to a week at the research institution managing the JoREP 2.0 database.

IRCRES CNR will also offer:

- a workplace to query the database and analyse data;
- tutoring and advise on the use of data.

RISIS project will cover the following costs:

- travel to the hosting site and back (airplane economy fare or train);
- accommodation and stay for 3 to 5 days based on per diem



PROCEDURE FOR THE ACCESS

Access to JoREP 2.0 database is offered through the RISIS webpage http://datasets.risis.eu

- Registration. Researchers need to register and agree on the conditions of use (good use of data, authorship, mentions to the RISIS project, agreement of posting results and aggregated datasets produced on RISIS website) via signing a charter of fair use.
- Visit request. A simple click to the botton 'visit request' next to 'JoREP 2.0 database' is needed in order to require a visit.
 The application dossier for visits should include:
- the application form completed;
- short description of the research project;
- short CV and publication list of the applicant.
- Selection. Applications will be first pre-screened by the RISIS partner involved in the specific facility (IRCRES CNR, in case of JoREP 2.0) and then assessed by the RISIS Project Review Board. The final decision will be taken by the RISIS Facility Coordination Board. Response will be provided within six weeks.
