Keynote Speakers



Santi Furnari is Professor of Strategy at Bayes Business School in London and a Visiting Professor at Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University in Chicago. He was a 2023-24 Fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University and previously served as Associate Dean for Executive Education at Bayes. Prof. Furnari studies how organizations can have social impact on local communities and society, for

example by shaping the emergence of new industrial clusters, new work practices, and new social spaces and places (such as social impact incubators and civic places). He is also an expert in organization design, business models and configurational thinking. Prof. Furnari is a multi-disciplinary researcher combining insights from sociology with organization theory, and using qualitative and mixed methods (such as fuzzy-set/Qualitative Comparative Analysis or fs/QCA). Prof. Furnari is Senior Editor at the journal Organization Studies and his research has been published in leading academic journals, such as the Academy of Management Review, the Academy of Management Journal, Management Science, Organization Science, Strategic Management Journal. From 2019 to 2022, Santi served as the Representative-at-large of the Organization and Management Theory (OMT) Division of the Academy of Management.



Marco di Tommaso is Full Professor of Applied Economics at the University of Bologna. After his studies in Italy and the United Kingdom, he has been visiting professor in China (South China University of Technology), the USA (University of California Los Angeles), and the UK (University of Cambridge). His research activities are focused on the following subjects: International Industry; Industrial Policy; Development and Structural Change; Local Development, SMEs and Clusters; Chinese Economy, Policy and Industry. He

has collaborated with different Italian and foreign universities, specialized research centers, international institutions (UNIDO, CEPAL, UNDP, OECD) and national and local governments. He has promoted and coordinated research projects in partnership with international networks of academics, universities and institutions. He is Principal Investigator of the EU Horizon 2020 Project REMAKING. He has actively presented his work in seminars, workshops and conferences, both in Italy and abroad. His papers have been disseminated and presented nationally and internationally: he is the author and co-author of numerous books and about 150 articles published in scientific journals.
